At Nexus-Woodbourne Family Healing, we understand the profound impact that emotional and behavioral mental health challenges have on youth, their families, and the broader community. Too often, accessing the right support feels out of reach.

As mental health continues to present significant and often overwhelming obstacles, we remain **committed to strengthening support systems and enhancing the continuum of care** and we do so with the same strength and resilience we see every day in the youth and families we serve.

Thanks to your support, 2024 was a year of growth, innovation, and meaningful experiences for the youth and families we serve. With an expansion of community partnerships and continued focus on healing, connection, and long-term impact, we advanced key initiatives that enriched programming, celebrated youth success, and strengthened our community:

- **Expansion of recreational programming**, offering youth more opportunities for structured on-campus activities, targeted therapeutic groups, and increased community engagement through partnerships and off-site outings. These enhancements promote social development, resilience, and connection with the broader community.
- Launch of Life After Woodbourne, a special event where alumni and youth who
  have transitioned on from our care, shared personal stories about their journeys
  post-treatment. Families, staff, and peers gathered to hear inspiring accounts of
  overcoming challenges, achieving goals, and building meaningful lives beyond
  Woodbourne.
- Introduction of the first-ever **Nexus-Woodbourne Unit Olympics**, fostering teamwork, healthy competition, and community spirit. Youth and staff participated in a month-long series of events, culminating in one unit earning the championship banner and celebrating their shared accomplishment.

#### **Our Services**

At Nexus-Woodbourne we work with youth and families facing some of the most complex trauma and mental health challenges to find hope and healing. Our services include:

#### **Residential Treatment**


Our program serves youth ages 12-18 struggling with their mental, behavioral, and emotional health and youth who have been or are at risk of commercial exploitation. We provide a safe, trauma-informed environment and intensive therapeutic supports that gives youth the tools to live safely with their families, within their communities or to live independently.

#### **On-Campus Education**

All students are capable of academic achievement, regardless of their history, mental health diagnosis, or their past school experience. Our clinical, medical and education program staff work in tandem so that each youth has an educational experience that supports them moving toward their newly discovered potential.

#### **Treatment Foster Care**

When a family system breaks down or a crisis occurs, we're here to help. Our Treatment Foster Care program trains and licenses treatment foster care parents to provide in-home care to youth who need a safe, stable home environment and mental health services.



#### The Youth We Serve

When each youth enters our care, we use the Child and Adolescent Needs and Strengths Assessment, a worldwide tool used to determine their level of care and address their behavioral health treatment plans. One of the areas this assessment evaluates is exposure to traumatic events. 73% of youth in our residential care have experienced four or more traumatic events in their lifetime compared to 50% of the general population experiencing at least one traumatic event in their lifetime.

- 80% Disruptions in Caregiving/Attachment loss
- 52% Neglect
- 44% Physical Abuse
- 43% Witness to Community/School Violence
- 40% Parental Criminal Behavior
- 40% Witness to Family Violence
- 37% Bulled by Others
- 35% Emotional Abuse
- 30% Sexual Abuse

## Support Today Stops Struggles Tomorrow

At Nexus-Woodbourne, we provide hope and healing in even the most complex and challenging situations because we know if there is no help it can lead to increased suicide rates, chronic health conditions, poor school performance, involvement in the juvenile justice system, homelessness, substance abuse, and more.

Access to services such as ours is critical in addressing acute needs. Together, with your support, we can help more youth find a better place.

When youth enter our residential services, they are struggling with multiple areas of need such as anger control, anxiety, depression, emotional regulation, adjustment to trauma, family functioning, and much more.

After completing treatment at Nexus-Woodbourne, the number of behavioral health needs of youth in our care had decreased by 25% putting them in a place to better navigate their futures.



# The Impact of Community Support Huddle Up for Health

At Nexus-Woodbourne Family Healing, we believe that healing does not end when youth leave our care, it evolves. Supporting our youth through their transitions is vital to their long-term success. We were proud to be selected as the recipient of the **Huddle Up for Health** grant, a collaborative initiative



between **CareFirst BlueCross BlueShield** and the **Baltimore Ravens** aimed at addressing public health challenges and health disparities.

Chosen from more than 100 applicants, Nexus-Woodbourne was honored for our ongoing commitment to serving youth who are navigating complex mental and behavioral health challenges. The \$50,000 grant has been instrumental in expanding our **Care Transition Program**, which supports youth as they reintegrate into their communities after treatment.

The goal is to ensure each youth has a roadmap to succeed outside our campus.

"Now with this generous award from CareFirst and the Baltimore Ravens, we can further support their recovery through a care transition program that will help our youth be successful as they rejoin their community and redefine their future," said Bryon Fracchia, Executive Director of Nexus-Woodbourne.

With this support, our youth receive enhanced continuity of care including resources and personalized guidance to build on the skills and stability they developed during their time with us. The goal is to ensure each youth has a roadmap to succeed outside our campus.




