For Nexus-PATH Family Healing, 2019 was an exciting year of service growth and diversification. We strengthened our ability to better meet the unique needs of children and families and we achieved great results in several key areas.

With a continued focus on trauma-informed care across all our services, we expanded outpatient clinical services in the areas of traditional therapy, rehabilitative services, and school-based targeted case management. Our school-based work allowed us to meet youth and families where they are, preventing the need for higher levels of care, and assisting our educators in supporting trauma-focused interventions.

Within the foster care arena, Nexus-PATH continued to diversify in providing both treatment foster care and regular foster care statewide, becoming even more specialized to meet the unique and challenging needs of youth and families.

As we go forward into 2020, diversity and specialization of services will continue to be the focus for long-term stability of our agency and those we serve. We will seek out more training opportunities to well-equip our staff and foster parents with the tools they need to do their important work. Infusing evidence-based trainings into our work will allow us to grow in new ways to better meet the needs of our clients.

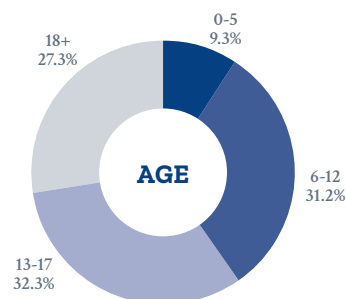
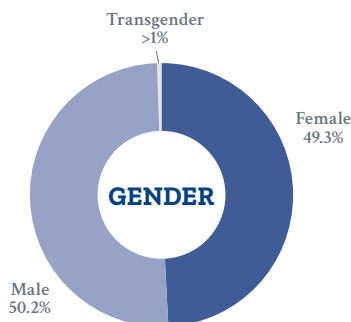
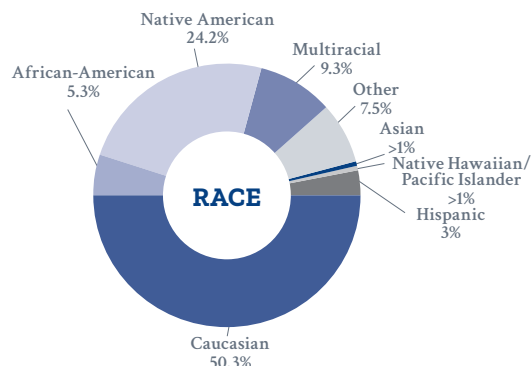

Nexus-PATH Family Healing provides foster care and community/outpatient mental health services throughout North Dakota. With nine locations across the state, we offer a variety of levels of foster care to meet the needs of foster children and those at risk of entering the child welfare system. The professionals in our outpatient/community mental health programs provide therapy and services that support individuals and families dealing with a wide range of concerns, including school adjustment problems, depression, anxiety, difficulty dealing with loss or family changes, abuse, traumatic experiences, attention problems, and parent-child conflicts. At Nexus-PATH, we believe **every child** is worth it and **every family matters**. We see that each time we help a child change the course of their life, we create the potential for healthier families, stronger communities, and a better world. Simply put, changing one life changes everything.

Focusing on Family

Jenna, age 8, was often frustrated and angry, would refuse to do her schoolwork, and was disruptive to her classmates. Although Jenna’s teacher tried many techniques to help her, the team felt Jenna needed additional support. They referred her to Nexus-Path’s school-based case management services.

Jenna’s school-based case manager, Maddie, took time to get to know Jenna and her family. Maddie learned there were four children living in the family’s small apartment and that Jenna’s mom and dad lived paycheck to paycheck, struggling to make ends meet each month. Maddie began to build a relationship with the family and made some recommendations for services.

As part of school-based case management services, Maddie set up an appointment with an eye clinic. Maddie ensured the clinic accepted Medicaid and that there was transportation to and from the clinic for the family. It was found that Jenna’s prescription had changed. She had been wearing the same pair of glasses for many years and did not know how to identify or communicate that she couldn’t see. Once Jenna had the correct eyeglasses, she was much more successful in the classroom.

Through other Nexus-PATH services, Jenna received a diagnosis of autism. This diagnosis helped her to qualify for additional supportive services in school and in her daily life. For further support, Maddie referred Jenna and her family to clinical programs and therapy through Nexus-PATH. The entire family continues to benefit from the support wrapped around them.

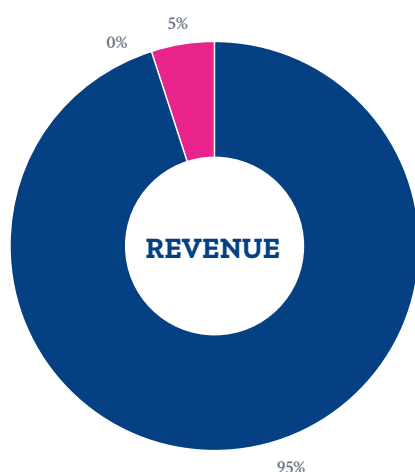

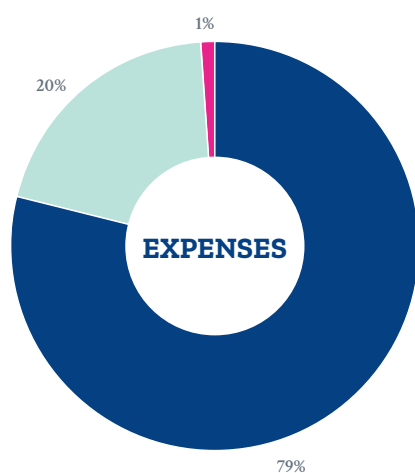
